First UMC has a new addition to our property in the form of a playground on the southwest corner of the east parking lot. This project began months ago with mem-

bers of the church having a dream to install a playground for the children of the church. This dream took a giant leap forward this past summer when an apartment building chose to remove their playground. We bought the equipment at a fraction of the cost to buy something new. Work began to install the playground this summer with the contractor who had removed the playground from the apartment complex. However, that contractor did not complete the job before leaving town.

The Leadership Team was able to secure new bids to install the playground and wisely chose to use money from the Richardson Fund, which is an endowment where the payouts are to support children's ministries, to pay for its installation. The playground was installed the week prior to the Soup Kitchen and Trunk-or-Treat. This allowed many people to see the new playground and the investment that this church makes in its children.

"I was a stranger and you welcomed me." Mathew 25:35 We walk among people each day, some we know and some we will never know. We sometimes have no connection or relationships with people who are different from ourselves. It seems it might be easier just to look the other way and show no concern. Many times, there is no eye contact and no words. We each just go about our tasks and move on not even thinking about it.

Long ago I had a South Dakota friend who traveled to New York City. She decided to use the subway to get to a specific museum she desired to visit. The subway was crowded with many people who were much different than she was. She wasn't sure who to ask for help from as she wasn't quite sure what stop the museum was at. She quickly looked around-there was someone speaking another language beside her, a woman from a different race with three small children working to keep them safe and then an unclean man carrying a small bag stuffed with old food. No one looked at her and she began to feel anxious not knowing who to ask about directions. Then all of a sudden, a young woman dressed all in black, wearing dark makeup and covered with tattoos made eye contact with her. There was a hesitant moment and then the young woman asked, "Can I help you?" My friend wasn't sure if this was the right person to ask but something nudged her to answer the question. "Is this where I get off to go to the Museum of Natural History?" The woman said, "No, get off at the next stop and go to the right and you will see the museum." She smiled looking into my friend's eyes and said, "Have a good day!" My friend responded, "Thank you." There was no connection between my friend and the young woman all dressed in black with tattoos whom she least expected would help her.

Just with her eye contact and a few words, my friend was shown some compassion by a stranger. When we are strangers—it is a different feeling. The young woman in black knew my friend wasn't from New York by the way she dressed and the way she talked but was willing to invest in helping another person in need. Today, I ask each of you to look into the eyes of someone different than you are. Say something pleasant, smile, open a door, and reach out by doing something needed by a stranger. Welcome new people to our church and our community. I am reminded

of a friend of mine who was asked by a homeless person for some money. My friend said, "What do you need the money for?" The man responded, "I just need the money." My friend asked a few more questions and finally the man said, "I'm hungry." My friend offered to walk with him to a cafe down the street for a good meal. He smiled and accepted the invitation. Not only did the man receive a much-needed good meal but also received compassion from another person. Remember relationships nurture compassion and help it thrive. Blessings to each of you as we offer compassion to strangers and to each other.
